It expects this exploration to add to both academic and popular discourse so as to help identify effective policy interventions. It carries out projects on specific policy related issues that simultaneously help develop our understanding of not just what inequality is, but also what it does. The programme is looking for two project associates to work on inequalities in the effects of climate change and on the digital divide.

Project Associates are expected to have a high degree of competence in one or more of three skills: secondary and survey data analysis, qualitative fieldwork, and editing and writing reports.

Qualifications
